## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ❖ This week at JET, after working extensively with her Employment Coordinator, YAIP Graduate E.B. from Cohort 13A has been hired by J.B. Security for site security. She passed her training at the top of her class, and was finally hired at a local LES worksite. \
- ❖ This week at Orchard Collegiate Academy we were thrilled to welcome back students for the new school year. We hosted a school-wide assembly to announce some fantastic initiatives for the school year, including a mascot contest, student government elections, school-wide attendance incentives, and our upcoming Family Night on September 29.
- ❖ This week in 301 Sports and Recreation we are beginning our 2016 fall season by kicking off tryouts for Sol Lain Flag Football.
