ACCOMPLISHMENTS

EDUCATION:

- The Orchard Collegiate Academy incoming 9th graders have continued to build relationships and skills for high school in Summer Bridge this week. They performed skits in which they demonstrated conflict mediation skills and began a project on their family histories in preparation for our trip to the Tenement Museum next week! We also enjoyed seeing Spiderman Homecoming as a group. Additionally, Ms. Sho represented OCA and Henry Street at an educational technology summit sponsored by the DOE, bringing back exciting ideas and tools for how to incorporate technology in the college counseling department and beyond.
- This week at PS 20, all campers used their creativity and imagination to create "Finding Dory" themed arts and craft projects. Unit A learned about origami to make Dory and Nemo envelope puppets. Unit B learned about different sea creatures after reading "Commotion in the Ocean" followed by creating their own underwater design using watercolors. Unit C made water bottle jelly fish by filling small plastic ziplock bags with water and submersing them into blue dyed water in recyclable water bottles. Lastly Unit D made Ocean Layers in a Jar during Mad Science using corn syrup, dish soap, water, oil, and rubbing alcohol. The campers then created and pasted miniature sea creature cut outs to represent the different species of sea life that lives within each layer.

- This week at Expanded Horizons, a group of our rising 11th and 12th grade students were able to participate in a guest lesson with candidates who are hoping to join our team as College Access counselors. In this process, it is important to us that our students are involved and are able to provide their perspectives and feedback. As we are in the swing of recruitment for our upcoming program year, we have continued to conduct visits to D1 and D2 high schools to build new connections and partnerships with DOE staff.
- This has been another exciting week at JRC Camp Henry. On Wednesday, the campers journeyed to one of the neighborhood parks to participate in a wild day of Wacky Olympics. Science and Fun Foods combined in the form of edible experiments. Learning about transduction, the campers made ice cream from milk using sandwich bags, water, and salt.
