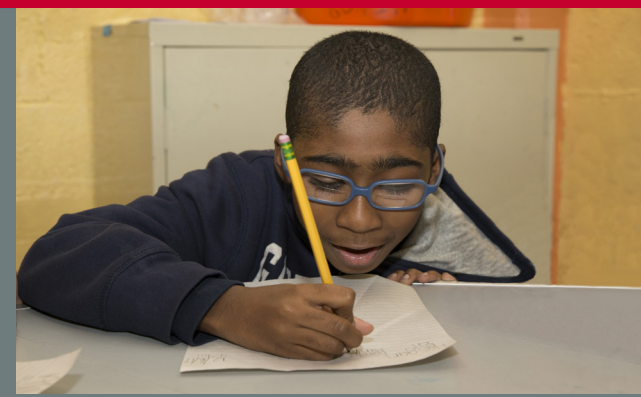


OUR COMMUNITY NEEDS BGR



What Is Boys & Girls Republic?

BGR is a Henry Street Settlement youth community center that has served tens of thousands of Lower East Side young people since the 1930s. Located amid the Jacob Riis and Lillian Wald public housing complexes, it is a refuge, a place of growth, and a symbol of community connectedness.

These are some of the challenges our neighbors face:

 **\$14,745** Median household income

 **66.7%** People over 16 unemployed

 **ONLY 7.4%** Bachelor's degree holders

In a neighborhood where low-income, immigrant, and minority families face intergenerational poverty, low educational attainment, environmental stressors, and violence

Free after-school enriches children's minds and improves their academic performance through high-quality homework help, dance and visual arts classes, and cooking and science projects.

A unique self-government program teaches the ins and outs of the democratic process and empowers youth to make important decisions.

Social workers lead social-emotional learning groups and provide individual counseling to build confidence and overcome trauma.

Summer day camp keeps kids active and safe while countering summer learning loss with fun and educational programming.

Sports & recreation programs include basketball clinics, league play, and tournaments; football leagues; and open gym, led by outstanding coach-role models, leading to self-esteem and college scholarships.

... BGR Changes Lives.

Each Year:



240 CHILDREN ages 5 to 13—a quarter of whom live in Henry Street's homeless shelters—enroll in after-school.



17 CHILDREN are elected into leadership positions each year.



80 CHILDREN participate in counseling sessions.



160 CHILDREN enroll in free camp.



380 YOUTH ages 12 to 19 develop their skills on and off the court through sports & rec activities.



the gym is open for **600** HOURS A YEAR giving neighborhood youth a safe space to play.

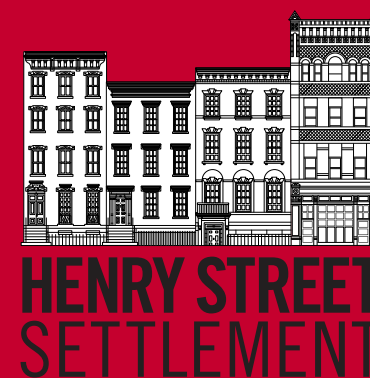
