THE NEW YORK STATE PRIMARY IS JUNE 23, 2020.

Which elections are being held?

Primary elections for Congress, State Assembly, State Senate, District Leader, and President, along with other local elections. View your ballot at [vote.nyc](https://www.vote.nyc).

How do I vote?

First, make sure you're registered at [vote.nyc](https://www.vote.nyc) or by calling **1.866.VOTE.NYC** (1.866.868.3692). If you're not registered, you must register by **MAY 29, 2020**, to vote in June.

Early in-person voting will be available **June 13-21**. Election Day is **June 23**.

HOWEVER, New Yorkers are encouraged to apply for an **absentee ballot** and vote by mail.

An absentee ballot? But I'm in New York!

Though polls are expected to be open, eligible voters are strongly encouraged to vote by absentee ballot to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT IS A TWO-STEP PROCESS.

STEP ONE: Apply for an absentee ballot by **June 16, 2020**, and wait for it to arrive in the mail.

✓ **IF YOU RECEIVED AN APPLICATION** for an absentee ballot in the mail, simply fill it out and return it **by June 16**. You will receive your absentee ballot in a few weeks.

✓ **IF YOU DID NOT RECEIVE AN APPLICATION** for an absentee ballot in the mail, you can apply for a ballot online at nycabsentee.com, by emailing absenteejune2020@boe.nyc, or by calling **1.866.VOTE.NYC** (1.866.868.3692)—**by June 16**.

✓ When you apply for a ballot, mark **"Temporary Illness"** as your reason, even if you're not sick! The definition has been temporarily expanded to include those affected by COVID-19, which means everyone.

STEP TWO: You'll receive an absentee ballot in the mail within a few weeks. Fill out the ballot, and follow the instructions to mail it in.

It must be postmarked by June 22, 2020, to count.
